These topics will cover all areas of the curriculum over the year. (Discrete Maths, PE, RE and Music lessons will be taught.)

Home Learning

- Children are expected to read their home reading book each night to consolidated their sound knowledge and reading skills. Please ensure your child's reading record is signed each night so we can confirm they are reading their books.
- Spellings will be set each week on Spelling Shed on Fridays. They will be changed weekly. In term
 2, we will introduce a spelling test in green Home Learning books.
- We do not set any maths learning at the beginning of the year but Numbots and Matheletics are available for math games and activities. In term 2, we will begin setting a maths activity on Mathletics weekly on a Friday. In term 3, we will introduce weekly number bond challenges for your child to complete.
- Topic Home Learning will be set once every term. Pupils are expected to complete at least one of the set tasks by the date stated on the sheet. Pupils will share this learning with the rest of the class and they will peer mark each others learning.
- Login details can be found in your child's reading recording and home learning information and strategies can be found in your child's green home learning book.

Phonics screening

- In term 5, children in Year 1 are expected to complete the phonics screening test. This involves reading a selection of cvc, cvcc, multisyllabic words and alien words accurately.
- Throughout the year we will be supporting your child in school to be successful in recognising set 1, 2 and 3 sounds and reading a variety of words that may appear in the test.
- We will send home materials at different points throughout the year that you may wish to use at home to further support your child with their reading and preparing them for the Phonics screening.
- We will provide more details of the test and share practise papers that you may wish to complete at home with you later in the year.
