Mathematics

During term 1 we will become increasingly confident at putting numerals in order 0 to 10. Through play and exploration, we will begin to recognise arrangements of objects and dots automatically - subitising.
We will also be learning language associated with size biggest, smallest, medium, tallest, shortest. RWI

During term 1, we will initially focus on our listening and attention skills, playing games that make us listen very carefully, differentiate and identify common noises.

We will develop our blending skills by playing lots of games. We will start to learn the first Read Write Inc sounds.

Please practise recognising your child's sounds flashcards in their book bag as this is really supporting their recognition. Remember to say the sound not the letter name. <u>Topic</u>

This topic will see the children investigate colours in their environment and how primary colours can be mixed to create secondary colours. The children will explore the text 'Find your happy' and learn all about emotions, how to express them and how other people feel. The children will read 'How the Crayons Saved the Rainbow' and will participate in a rainbow hunt, make kindness cards for members of the local community and create a map of the story. As part of Harvest the children will investigate the colours, shapes and tastes of a range of fruits and vegetables, this will link to our learning around the text 'The Very Hungry Caterpillar'.

Our Daily Routine

8.40-9.15 - Children self-register, choose their lunch option and play in provision.

9.15-9.30 - Motor skills development - developing fine motor skills and their ability to move with control and coordination.

9.30-9.50 – RWI which is a phonics scheme that works with children in small groups to develop their skills and knowledge in this area.

9.50-11 -Child Initiated - children select where they would like to learn and play in a carefully designed environment.

11-11.20 - Storytelling groups focusing on oral literacy skills, understanding of language and early reading and writing.

11.20-11.30 - Prepare for lunch and singing

11.30-12.30 – Children are supported to eat and play outside

12.30-1 - Children engage in group work.

1-2.30- Child Initiated

2.30- 2.50 - Children work on their Mathematics skills.
