



Dear Parents/Carers and Children,

This booklet has been put together to give you helpful information about your child moving into Year Three. We hope you find the information useful.

We look forward to working with you over the coming year.

Where do I take my child on their first day in Year 3? Both of the Year Three classrooms are situated on the V playground. There will always be an adult from Year 3 to welcome your child into the classroom with a smile! The other adults will encourage your child to put their belongings away and will be available to settle them into the classroom.



How important is my child's attendance?

Very Important! Just like in Year Two, we encourage a high level of attendance and punctuality at Repton Manor. Children need to attend school every day unless they are ill. Children who attend every day and arrive on time do better than those who have low attendance and poor

punctuality.



Once they are in Year 3, does everything change? Your child is now in the Juniors! Our aim is to ensure that the children experience a smooth transition from the Infants into the Juniors. The Year 2 team will be sharing all of their expert knowledge of their classes with the Year 3 team and will continue to support them during the transition period. The Year Three curriculum builds upon and extends the experiences that children have had in Year Two. They will engage in some extremely exciting topics and take part in some fantastic offsite visits. We want to ensure our children remain motivated, enthused and eager learners so they continue to have opportunities to independently explore during Challenge Time.

A Typical Day in Year 3:

8:45am-9am: Early morning learning and registration

9am-9:30am: Assembly 9:30am-10:15am: Reading lesson 10.15am-10.30am: DEAR time (Reading focus) 10:30am-10:45am: Break time 10:45am-11:30am: Mathematics 11:30am-12.15pm: Writing 12.15pm-1.15pm: Lunchtime 1.15pm-2.30pm: Topic/ Challenge Time 2.30pm-3pm: Topic 3pm-3.15pm: Class Reader 3.15pm: Children go home

The children will also have PE lessons twice a week. PE days will be confirmed and communicated in September.

Will my child still be provided with a free snack? The children in Year 3 will have playtime with the rest of the school at 10:30am-10:45am.

They will need to bring a healthy snack to school each day that they would like to eat whilst they enjoy some outside play time.

What happens at lunchtime now my child is in Year Three? When the children are in Year 3 they eat their lunch from 12.15pm. Children can no longer access a universal infant free school meal during Year Three unless they are entitled to Free School Meals. If you think you are eligible for Free School Meals, please find the link on our website to apply.

You can pay for your child's hot dinner costing £2.20 per pupil per day using the Arbor app. Alternatively, they can bring a healthy packed lunch. Once they have finished their lunch, they will be able to have playtime outside until 1.15pm. They will continue to be supported by familiar adults during this time.





OPAL PLAY AT LUNCHTIMES




Repton Manor is an Opal Play school! Opal's vision is that every child in school has an amazing hour of high quality play every day – with no exceptions.

Please ensure that your child





has wellington boots and a waterproof jacket in school everyday so that they can access all areas at playtime. Sunhats are essential in the summer months.



Does my child need a PE bag in Year Three?

No, your child needs to arrive at school in their PE kit on their assigned PE days. This will be communicated via the weekly bulletin.

Will my child still bring home a reading book?

They will bring home Accelerated Reader reading books. It remains just as important that your child reads at home daily in Year Three. They will complete a quiz relating to the book they've read in school, this ensures the children have comprehended the story.

They will also continue to bring home a library book each week that they have independently chosen.

Will my child have Home Learning in Year Three?

Reading: The children will be asked to read their reading books each day. **Spellings:** They will have spellings set each week and they can practice these on Spelling Shed. It is important that they practice these to develop their knowledge of spelling patterns.

Maths: They will continue to use Timetables Rock Stars to develop their knowledge of times tables. Children can also focus on particular Maths skills using Mathletics.

Topic: Each term, the children will be asked to complete Home Learning challenges from the termly grid.

Will I still be able to speak to my child's teacher informally?

Of course! Your child's teacher will be at the door each morning and after school and is available for you to speak to briefly. If you need a longer conversation, please be aware that after school is preferable.


