Years: 5 and 6

Curriculum Theme: Nurture and Equality

Current Topic (s):

Reading	Writing (GPS)	Maths
Read with an adult every night for at least 20 minutes if you are a free reader.	Practise spellings every night. Write your spelling in a sentence. This will develop knowledge of word meaning and sentence structure. Please see the spelling strategies sheet for more information. You will have a weekly GPS worksheet stuck into your Home Learning book that you will be required to complete.	Times Tables are the foundation to understanding and accuracy in solving a range of mathematical areas. Ensure that you practise your times tables regularly to improve your speed and accuracy of times tables recall. There will be a weekly task set on Mathematics linked to what you have been learning in class that you will be required to complete.
