Secondary Ready Plan

Over the course of the year, we will be preparing your children for their forthcoming transition to secondary school over three phases.

These are progressive with the skills building upon each other and of course not an extensive list as there will naturally be many discrete skills, behaviours and attitudes that we will naturally teach across the course of the year as a result of our teaching practise.

Please note that these may be adapted and change as a result to the children's needs and us having to prioritise to best prepare children as they begin the next stage of their educational career.

Long Term Plan

Terms 1 and 2

Foci:

- Behaviours for learning (growth mindset, ownership of learning).
- Respecting ourselves and those around us.
- Communication of behaviours through Class Charts.
- Grouping in Maths according to individual needs.

Long Term Plan


Terms 3 and 4

- Begin 'secondary set up' where children will be re-grouped and will have different teachers for different lessons (ensuring they are still regularly having their Class Teacher). Children will be responsible for their own timetable and ensuring that they going to the correct classroom for their lessons and have the appropriate equipment for these. We will communicate this plan in greater detail in Term 3.
- Developing independence through Genius Hour projects.

Long Term Plan

Terms 5 and 6


- Developing independence and confidence, particularly within Life Skills through experiences such as PGL (the development of these skills will of course be prioritised throughout the year in the build up to this).
- Life Skills preparation for secondary school (e.g., how to tie a tie).
- Support for social elements of secondary school.
- Closure on their primary school career.



Behaviours for Learning - **Developing A Growth Mindset**

Over the course of the year, we will be focusing on developing the children's learning behaviours in preparation for secondary school and beyond.

We will be developing Growth Mindsets (based on the work by the world renown psychologise Carol Dweck) through our class and phase assemblies and using everyday teaching strategies that encourage children to realise that ability and intelligence are not fixed traits.



Behaviours for Learning – Ownership over our Learning

In Year 6, we will be encouraging the children to take ownership over their own learning by developing their independence and encouraging them to take pride in their learning. We will be doing this not only through a series of project-based activities, but also through our everyday classroom practice.

For example:

- Encouraging children to use Growth Mindset language to identify areas that they are proud of.
- Providing children with the time and learning opportunities to be critically reflective of their learning and then improve their learning as a result of these.
- Setting high expectations and standards for the presentation and quality of their learning, both in school and at home.

Communication of Behaviour-Class Charts



At Repton Manor, we use a program called Class Charts to track positive (house points) and negative (yellow and red cards) behaviours. In preparation for both children and parents, we will be opening up parent accounts to *only* parents of Year 6 children.

We have chosen this system as the way that it will communication behaviours is similar to those that local secondary schools use.


On Wednesday 7th August, you child will be given all of their logins for online platforms that they can use and, with these, will be your parent account login for Class Charts along with instructions as to how to set this up.


Communication of Behaviour-Class Charts



Once set up, you will be able to receive notifications (if you allow these) or able to access your child's behaviour points. You will see:

- When they receive House Points and what these are for. These will be for one of our three school rules.
- Any Yellow Cards, along with a brief description as to why this sanction has been given.
- Any Red Cards, along with a brief description as to why this sanction has been given. Red Cards will now be communicated by Mrs Chambers (Head of School) and Mr Page (Deputy Headteacher). Kent Test/PESE/11+

- Children will sit the test in a Year 6 classroom with at least two adults within the room. An external invigilator may be present along with internal invigilation from a member of SLT.
- Usually, the test will be structured as follows:
 - Reading
 - Maths
 - Break
 - Reasoning (Verbal, non-verbal, spatial)
 - Lunch
 - Writing Task

Kent Test/PESE Results: Tuesday 18th October 2022

 Later in the Year, the school will host an information evening should your child not get the required pass mark to attend a grammar school and you wish to appeal that they should receive an education at a grammar school. We will communicate details for this nearer to the time.

KS2 SATs: A Parents' Guide

- In the summer term of 2016, children in Y2 and Y6 were the first to take new SATs tests. The current SATs for English and maths reflect the updated national curriculum and are more rigorous than previous years' tests. There is also a completely new SATs marking scheme and grading system which has replaced national curriculum levels.
- What are SATs? At the end of Y6, English schoolchildren sit national tests in Reading, Maths and Spelling, punctuation and grammar (SPAG). These tests are both set and marked externally, and the results are used to measure the school's performance (for example, through reporting to Ofsted and published league tables). Your child's marks will be used in conjunction with teacher assessment to give a broader picture of their attainment.

Reading



KS2 reading The reading test is a single paper with questions based on three passages of text. Your child will have an hour, including reading time, to complete the test which typically totals 50 marks. There will be a selection of question types, including:

- Ranking/ordering, for example, 'Number the events below to show the order in which they happen in the story'
- Find and copy, e.g. 'Find and copy a word that suggests what the weather is like in the story'
- Short constructed response, for example: 'What does the bear eat?'
- Inference and explanation-based questions, for example: 'How can you tell that Veronika did not trust Yuri to pack her bag properly?'

In 2018 the Department for Education announced that the reading content of KS2 SATs will be closely linked to the curriculum in future years to ensure children are drawing on their knowledge when answering reading comprehension questions.

KS2 Grammar, Punctuation and Spelling



The GPS test consists of two parts:


- a grammar and punctuation paper requiring short answers, lasting 45 minutes
- An aural spelling test of 20 words, lasting around 15 minutes.

The grammar and punctuation test includes two sub-types of questions:

- Selected response, e.g. 'Identify the adjectives'
- Constructed response, e.g. 'Correct/complete/rewrite the sentence below,'
 or, 'The sentence below has an apostrophe missing. Explain why it needs
 an apostrophe.'

The two tests' scores are then added together to generate your child's overall test score for this section of the SATs.

KS2 Maths



Children sit three papers in maths:

Paper 1 (arithmetic, 30 minutes),

Papers 2 and 3 (reasoning, 40 minutes each).

Paper 1 consists of fixed response questions (children have to give correct answers to calculations).

Papers 2 and 3 involve question types that require solving calculations, including multiple choice and a range of questions that will cover the entire primary curriculum.

Your child will then receive an accumulative mark from all three tests (typically out of 110) to determine their out in Maths at the end of KS2.



Other end of KS2 Assessments



Although they will not sit formal exams, your child will also be assessed in the following:

Writing – Your child will be assessed from their writing over the course of Year 6 over a range of genres using the Teacher Assessment Framework. Your child will be assessed as either Working Below, Working Towards, Expected or Greater Depth.

Science – Your child's class teacher will assess whether or not they are working at the expected level following their coverage of the Primary Science Curriculum.
