<p><b>Reception</b></p>	<p>We had a lovely term four together, the children have lovely learning about Water. They have loved learning about the Billy Goats Gruff and have been busy re-enacting the story. Our Pirate Day was fabulous fun and we enjoyed lots of pirate themed activities. Our new Topic is 'I spy a naughty little rabbit'.</p> <p>The children will launch this topic by looking at the work of Beatrice Potter and how this compares to the children’s TV programme, Peter Rabbit. They will explore how Beatrice Potter wrote the text and how current authors write using technology. The children will be authors and illustrators, creating their own animal-based stories. The children will have opportunities to explore the outside environment, looking at places an animal chooses to live and learning why. The children will categorise animals based on their characteristics. They will have opportunities to watch minibeasts, plants and foods grow and comment on the changes they see, recording them in ways they choose.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>❖ Please ensure your child has a PE kit in school. We’d be very grateful if you practice the skill of dressing and undressing independently in preparation for PE lessons.</li> <li>❖ Please bring in reading books and records in every day.</li> <li>❖ PE is on a Monday and PE kits can stay in school all term.</li> <li>❖ NCMP catch up session – 25<sup>th</sup> April</li> </ul>
<p><b>Year 1</b></p>	<p>In Topic, we will be exploring toys and technology from the past and present. We will sort toys into old and new and place them onto a timeline. We will practice observational drawing skills of a chosen favourite toy and design our own futuristic toy using knowledge of how toys have changed over time.</p> <p>In English, we will read and story map the story ‘Lost in the Toy Museum’. We will then innovate our own versions of the story. We will be applying everything we have learnt throughout the year to ensure we are writing accurate sentences and beginning to write longer narrative with a clear beginning, middle and end.</p> <p>In Maths this term we will be learning about simple multiplication, division and fractions. We will focus on securing counting in 2s, 5s and 10s, grouping and sharing quantities and finding a half and a quarter of a shape and numbers. We are also focusing on writing numbers accurately. Year 1 children are encouraged to write all numbers the correct way around and in the correct order by the end of the year.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>❖ Dover Transport Museum trip – closes 10<sup>th</sup> May</li> <li>❖ Phonics event – 3.30pm, 7th May</li> <li>❖ PE days – Tuesday and Wednesday</li> </ul>
<p><b>Year 2</b></p>	<p>In Reading, those children still on Read Write Inc will continue to be sent home with 2 RWI books to read. For the children who are off programme, they will bring a home a book of their choice that is matched to their ability level. Once they have finished their book, they will complete a quiz in school to check their understanding of what they have read. We would like children to complete 20 minutes of reading at home every day and for parents to then sign their reading records so we can keep track in school.</p> <p>In Maths, we will continue learning about multiplication and division and will focus on our 2,5 and 10 times tables. We will then move onto learning how to measure height and length in centimetres and meters. We will learn how to measure accurately using a standard ruler and meter stick and will</p>



	<p>then look at comparing and ordering different lengths and heights. Numbots or TTRS should be accessed regularly too.</p> <p>In Writing, our focus will be on using accurate punctuation, exciting adjectives and powerful verbs to advance the action in our story. We will then complete an information page about Kenya to include all of the things we have learnt so far. We will learn how to set out our facts and add interesting details to keep our reader engaged. We will write some springtime poetry too.</p> <p>This term will focus on a new topic 'All about Kenya'. First we will learn some African drumming and then we will board 'Repton Airways' to fly to Kenya and explore the country. We will be looking at similarities and differences in areas and comparing to our country too. We will look at how Kenyans live, what is important to them and learn more about their lifestyle and culture. We will end with cooking a delicious meal inspired by what we have learnt. Our Science unit will explore plants and we will learn how to grow some delicious ingredients.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>❖ PE days - Tuesday and Thursday</li> </ul>
<p><b>Year 3</b></p>	<p>Welcome back to all our lovely year 3 students! This term we are learning all about Ancient Greece! We've got a fantastic graphic novel based on Ancient Greek myths to read though and inspire us with amazing ideas for re-writing our own versions of a well-known Greek myth! We can't wait to get practical with some orienteering and map work as the weather improves then moving on to investigating how muscles and skeletons help us to move about. It's going to be an active, busy term so we hope you've all had a restful break!</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>❖ Please ensure your child reads at least 5 times a week and that you sign your child's reading record.</li> <li>❖ PE days – Wednesday and Friday</li> </ul>
<p><b>Year 4</b></p>	<p>Grab your shield and your bow and arrow, we are learning about the Anglo-Saxons and Scots! Our topic this term will be action-packed and full of excitement. We will be going back over 1,600 years to a time where you would settle an argument with a fight to the death. Alongside our Anglo-Saxons topic, we will be looking at electricity, cities and villages in the UK, Buddhism and cricket. In English we will be delving into our new class reader, Anglo Saxon Boy – an exciting tale of Magnus and how he ended up participating in The Battle of Hastings. Our Multiplication Check is fast approaching, so we are doing as much practise in class as possible to prepare ourselves. Our Year 4 production kicks off in Term 5 and we will be having weekly practise sessions with our director from The Primary Shakespeare Company. This year we are excited to be performing 'Julius Caesar.' Our children have already had a visit from The Primary Shakespeare Company and they adored the performance of 'Julius Caesar' that had been adapted by the company. <p><b>Year 5</b></p>	<p>What a year it's been and we can't quite believe how quickly it has gone so far! This term, we are beginning our new topic of 'Survival'. In this exciting topic, we will be exploring different biomes, climate zones and how to survive in these; navigating using a compass; the properties of materials;</p>



	<p>life cycles of animals; how to survive in the wild using a combination of knowledge and practical skills!</p> <p>In English, we will be exploring the phenomenal 'Kensuke's Kingdom' by Michael Morpurgo and composing pieces of both fiction and non-fiction writing, including exciting thrillers and non-chronological reports.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>❖ PE days – Monday and Wednesday</li> </ul>
<p><b>Year 6</b></p>	<p>Next term, our topic will be Battles that have shaped our world. During this topic we will be delving into history and exploring WW1 and WW2 and how this impacted lives in our country as well as the wider world. In addition to this, we will also be learning about the circulatory system of humans and other animals.</p> <p>Our writing will be a flashback narrative where the children will be placing themselves in the shoes of someone on a battlefield. We will also be using this term to revise some key concepts before SATS in May.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>❖ Homewood Transition Week is on the following dates this year: 1st July - 4th July (so just the 4 days Monday to Thursday).</li> <li>❖ PE days – Wednesday and Friday</li> </ul>
