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Summer Holiday Reading

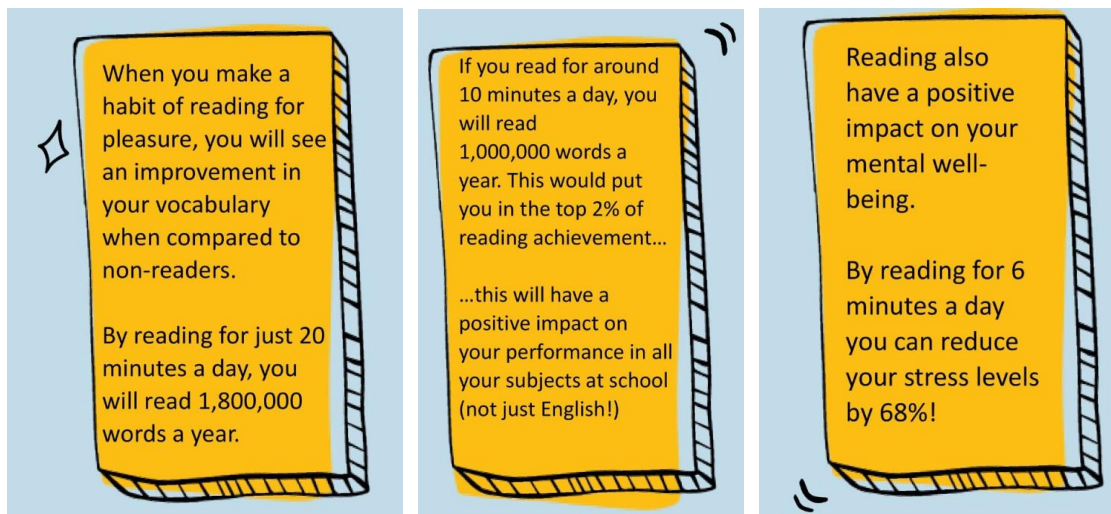
Dear Families,

The following challenges have been put together by Mr Graham, our new Reading Leader, who will be joining us in September. It would be great if you could send some pictures in of your child completing the challenges, so that we can share these as a school in September.

Repton Manor Primary School Summer reading challenge

Throughout this Summer Holiday, we are asking you to have a go at the Summer Reading Bingo Challenge. Each time you complete one of the boxes, tick it off and collect a picture of you completing the challenge! Then, if you complete a line, you will earn some house points when you return to school. If you complete the whole bingo challenge, you will receive a small prize from your teacher when you return to school. Don't forget to bring in the photos of you completing the challenges as evidence! Each book can tick off multiple boxes. E.g. If you read a book where the main colour on the front cover is yellow, with an animal as the main character, a title between 3 and 5 words, and read it in an unusual place, then you could tick off 4 boxes with just 1 book!

A book with the main character being an animal.	Read a book about sport.	Read a poem.
Read in an unusual place	Read a story set in a different continent.	Read some of a book to a family member.
Read a book with yellow being the main colour on the front cover.	Read a book with a title that is between 3 and 5 words.	Read a picture book.
